executors and administrators firmly by these presents, SEALED with our seals
DATED this day of in the year of
our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty two.

The Condition

of this obligation is such that if the said Margaret Mary Buzzard
with the Will annexed
the administratrix of all and singular the property of MILLAR BUZZARD formerly a Lieut-
enant in the Australian Imperial Forces abroad but late of Moora in the
State of Western Australia Farmer

deceased, do and shall well and truly collect and administer according to law the property,
lands and hereditaments, goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased at the time of
his death which shall come to the power or control, hands or possession of her as his
administratrix or of any other person or persons for her and do and shall make or cause
to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the property, lands and
hereditaments, goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased which shall have come
