nity Training School situated near Mengo Hospital. There the native girls are given instruction and trained to be efficient nurses. The final examination is quite stiff, so that when the girls leave the hospital they are capable of undertaking the most complicated cases.

Miss Smith is very pleased to be right out in the country, where she will have more opportunities of doing direct evangelistic work. Besides those in the school here, three others come in every afternoon, from out-stations where school is only held in the mornings. They have their extra tuition then.
