
Albert George HALL (1896-1916)

Albert Edward Hall's connection to South Lopham is by birth and residency.

Albert's brother William also died in The Great War.

Albert George HALL, son of William HALL (c. 1857-c. 1940) and Emma CORBLE (c. 1859-c. 1944), was born on 29 August 1896 in South Lopham, Norfolk.¹ He was baptised on 30 May 1897 in South Lopham, the ceremony was conducted by Rev. A CALDECOTT, curate - parents William (labourer) and Emma.

On 31 Mar 1901, (the 1901 Census), he was living at Low Dragway in South Lopham - 4, living with parents William (43, agricultural labourer) and Emma (42), and siblings William (20, teamman on farm), Frank (18, stockman on farm), Ellen (16), Alfred (14) and Edward (12).²

In the 1911 Census (2 Apr 1911) he appeared at Rectory Road in South Lopham - 14, farm labourer, living with parents William (53, farm labourer) and Emma (52), siblings Ellen (25) and Edward (22, farm labourer), and nephew? William (4).³

Albert died on 4 December 1916 - died of wounds in No. 6 Field Hospital, Rouen.

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission grave registration entry for Albert was "HALL, Pte. A. G., 5360. 4th Bn. Northumberland Fusiliers. 4th Dec., 1916. O. III. G. 3."

Albert is commemorated at St. Sever Cemetery Extension, Rouen - O. III. G. 3.
