STRATTON, or STRATTON ST. MARY, with Hempnall, Stotisham, & Stoke Holy Cross.

A PARISH in the hundred of Depwade, county of Norfolk, and diocese of Norwich, rated in the king's books at 10l. in the patronage of the Master and fellows of Caius College, Cambridge. The church in old records is called Stratton-cum-Turri, by which it appears that the other two Strattons had churches without steeples. The Roman road leading to Ad Tuam, or Tasburgh, passes through the parish. Several Roman urns, one of them curiously ornamented, were found in 1773, on opening a gravel pit, near which a sepulchral hearth has since been discovered, with a mixture of ashes and burnt earth upon it.
